# E-Rideables & E-Bikes

At our Community Meeting Snr Sgt Brennan from Hillarys Police Station provided us with information about E-bikes and E-rideables, the rules, action being taking about unlawful and dangerous behaviour and how residents can help if they experience issues. Residents are encouraged to report any issues. Video and images are helpful but only should be taken when it is safe to do so.

## Overview of Rules from the Road Safety Commission

### Rules for riding your eBike safely and legally



Check before you buy: eBikes must meet WA legal standards

Motor must cut out at 25km/h

\*The same road rules apply for riding regular push bikes and eBikes.

eBikes must be primarily pedal-powered

### ERIDEABLE CURRENT LAWS

One person per device	Helmets required	Age requirement	Bell or verbal warning
Lights and reflectors required	Speed on footpaths	Speed on bike paths, shared paths and local roads	No travel on roads

eRideables include eScooters, eSkateboards, hoverboards, eSkates, and eUnicycles  
Other devices such as mobility scooters, motorised wheelchairs, or low-powered motorised scooters for children are not considered eRideables & are covered by their own rules.

### ARE YOU AND YOUR FAMILY COMPLIANT?

Update From Caitlin Collins MLA Member for Hillarys

**Parliamentary Inquiry** into the safety, regulation and penalties associated with the use of electric powered mobility devices: Findings have been provided to Parliament and are being considered. One immediate action is detailed below.

**Riding or Storage at WA Public Schools:** From the start of Term 1 2026 (February 2) students under 16s will not be permitted to use or store eRideables and eBikes on WA public schools. This measure is in place to support student safety and ensure compliance with road safety laws.

**Operation Moorhead:** Launched in Joondalup on January 5, following community concern about dangerous and anti-social riding behaviour and continues to address the issues.

Racially or religiously offensive / threatening graffiti call Police 131 444

Committee Members attended a free session on the issue of graffiti in 2025. Some info shared was -

- Reporting and consistent removal of graffiti discourages offenders.
- Unsure about who to report to? Report to the City, who will forward your report to the right place.
- Provide as much info on location as possible.
- The city cleans graffiti from City-owned property and only from private property with permission.
- Take photos to include in the report. These can be added to the Police database of tags to support enforcement action.
- Graffiti costs Australians approximately more than \$30 million each year on clean-ups.

### What is the role of City of Joondalup Field Officers?

⇒ Maintaining community safety and ensuring compliance with local laws.

### What are their Daily Operations?

⇒ Proactive patrols across public spaces, including parks, reserves, and urban areas.

⇒ Respond to community reports and complaints, investigate incidents, and provide a visible presence in the community. Below is a useful guide on who to call -

The City's Field Officers maintain a strong collaborative relationship with local WA Police, participating in joint public safety initiatives but their powers, roles, and responsibilities are fundamentally different. Field Officers can only act on Local Government and public property.
